Mechanic II

JOB OVERVIEW

This is a skilled mechanical work on automotive and heavy equipment which includes services, preventable maintenance and welding duties. Day to day operations is under the supervision of the Mechanic III Supervisor. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Road Superintendent and is reviewed on the basis of work performed. This is a full-time position working 4 days a week/10 hour days with all full-time benefits including health ins., paid time off, state retirement, etc.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Graduation from high school or vocational school, or completion of GED, with trade school courses in repair of automotive and heavy equipment; 3 years' experience in servicing, maintaining and repairing gasoline and diesel equipment; or any equivalent combination of training and experience. Possession of a valid Florida Driver's License.

- Knowledge of applicable work and safety rules and procedures.
- Knowledge of and ability to perform skilled welding tasks.
- Ability to carry out complex oral and written instructions.
- Skill in locating and adjusting defects in automotive and heavy equipment.
- Ability to read and understand job related material.
- Ability to lift weights up to sixty (60) pounds.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES

Note: The following duties are illustrative and not exhaustive. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position. Depending on assigned area of responsibility, incumbents in the position may perform one or more of the activities described below.

- Trouble-shoots, repairs, maintains and reconditions trucks, tractors, graders, loaders and other equipment used in construction and maintenance of roads.
- Disassembles defective equipment and replaces defective parts.
- Performs skilled welding on machinery and equipment.
- Makes metal articles such as hitches, trailers, repair parts for machinery, implements and equipment.
- Purchases parts and material.
- Performs related work as required.
- Reports to the Road Superintendent.

This classification description is not intended to be, nor should it be construed as an all-inclusive list of the duties associated with a particular position. Management may require incumbents to perform job duties other than those contained in this document at any time.
